First, St. Gabes is building an amazing and highly innovative school addition in the old convent, to keep the school at the pinnacle of Catholic education in St. Louis. Second, we're adding a much-needed Welcome Room to further build the community; the Welcome Room could host your next alumni or family reunion.

The Center for Innovative Learning

Modern teaching methods are changing rapidly, inspiring St. Gabriel to create the Center for Innovative Learning in the Gabriel House (the former convent). After a full gut-rehab, the Center will house highly innovative collaborative "flex spaces" that combine cross-discipline teaching and student collaboration to solve the problems of today. Top high schools and middle schools are now educating their students using the same methods.

The Center will be purpose-built for students in grades seven and eight but will provide opportunities for use by children of all grades, and for full parish use during non-school hours. The band room and chapel will be renovated, too.

Holy Name Hall (The Welcome Room)

With a lead gift from the Holy Name Society, the Parish is building a critically needed Holy Name Welcome Room between the front door of the Church and the rectory. Aesthetically it will match the look of the Church and provide space for up to 100 parishioners and guests for fellowship after Mass, pre-wedding and pre-funeral activities, Parish meetings, and much more. A fireplace will highlight the space. The room is for full parish and school use.

This room will build community and help make St. Gabes even more welcoming to all – parishioners and visitors alike – as God intended.





Holy Name Hall is going to change how we welcome people. It will build community by inviting parishioners, guests, alumni, neighbors – everyone – to gather in fellowship.
